4. Building a winning presentation!! Models and practice.
5. Saying everything necessary at the allocated time.
6. Illustrative measures and devices.
7. Dress code.
8. "Death by PowerPoint" – Presenting without a presentation.
9. Assessing self-success. Measures need to be taken. Amendments.

Duration: 2+1 full days 09:00-17:00

2 days for learning and experiencing and one day for monitored presentations.
